

Our Three Legacies

UNITY - The Twelve Traditions - Tradition Eight

Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional. We define professionalism as the occupation of counseling alcoholics for fees or hire. But we may employ alcoholics were they are going to perform these services for which we may otherwise have to engage nonalcoholics. Such special services may be well recompensed. But our usual A.A. "12th Step" work is never to be paid for.

RECOVERY - The Twelve Steps - Step Eight

Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

"Now we need more action, without which we find that "Faith without works is dead." Let's look at *Steps Eight and Nine.*" pg. 76, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, aka *The Big Book*

"...Learning how to live in the greatest peace, partnership, and brotherhood with all men and women, of whatever description, is a moving and fascinating adventure. Every A.A. has found that he can make little headway in this new adventure of living until he first backtracks and really makes an accurate and unsparing survey of the human wreckage he has left in his wake. ...But if a willing start is made, then the great advantages of doing this will so quickly reveal themselves that the pain will be lessened as one obstacle after another melts away."


