





Breathing: A Tool for Serenity


For many in Alcoholics Anonymous, meditation and breathing techniques serve as essential tools for emotional balance and spiritual growth. Step 11 from "How it Works" emphasizes the importance of seeking "through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him." While prayer fosters connection, meditation deepens awareness, bringing clarity and inner peace.

Simple practices such as deep belly breathing or box breathing (inhale for four seconds, hold for four, exhale for four, hold for four) can restore balance.

Incorporating Meditation and Breathing into Daily Recovery

- Morning Reflection start the day with five minutes of mindful breathing or meditation to set a tone of peace and gratitude.
- Before Meetings a brief meditation before an AA meeting can help center thoughts and prepare for sharing.
- Nightly Inventory meditation before bed helps process emotions and promotes restful sleep.

Addiction's grip had turned to grace, A heart once shattered found its place. The past a lesson, the pain a guide, To walk with love, with faith beside.




