THE LIMITS OF SELF-RELIANCE

We asked ourselves why we had them [fears]. Wasn't it because self-reliance failed us?

All of my character defects separate me from God's will. When I ignore my association with Him I face the world and my alcoholism alone and must depend on self-reliance. I have never found security and happiness through self-will and the only result is a life of fear and discontent. God provides the path back to Him and to His gift of serenity and comfort. First, however, I must be willing to acknowledge my fears and understand their source and power over me. I frequently ask God to help me understand how I separate myself from Him.

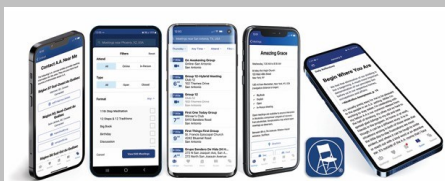

Breathing: A Tool for Serenity

For many in Alcoholics Anonymous, meditation and breathing techniques serve as essential tools for emotional balance and spiritual growth. Step 11 from "How it Works" emphasizes the importance of seeking "through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him." While prayer fosters connection, meditation deepens awareness, bringing clarity and inner peace.

Simple practices such as deep belly breathing or box breathing (inhale for four seconds, hold for four, exhale for four, hold for four) can restore balance.

Incorporating Meditation and Breathing into Daily Recovery

- Morning Reflection - start the day with five minutes of mindful breathing or meditation to set a tone of peace and gratitude.
- Before Meetings - a brief meditation before an AA meeting can help center thoughts and prepare for sharing.
- Nightly Inventory - meditation before bed helps process emotions and promotes restful sleep.

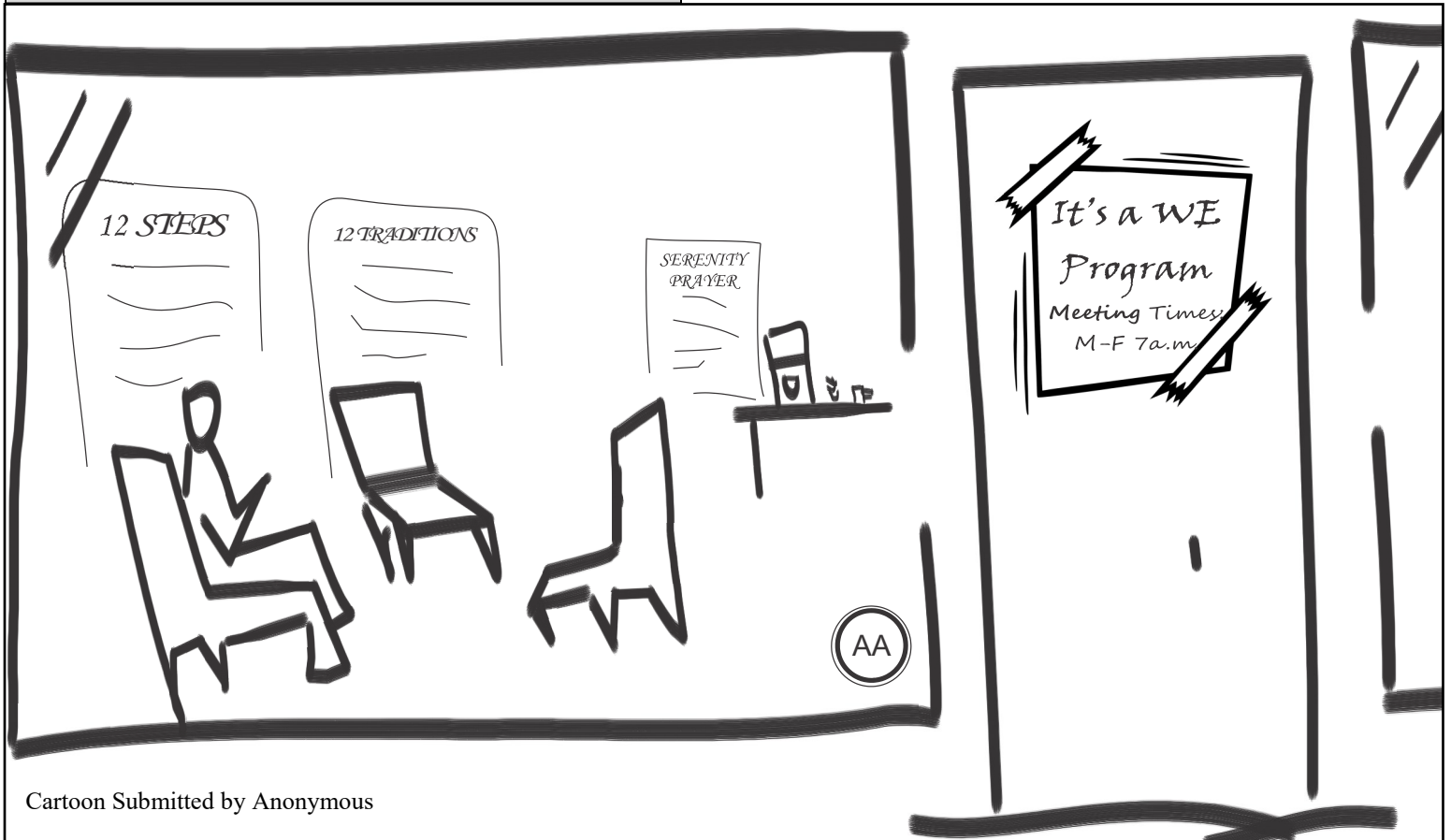

To walk with love, with faith beside.

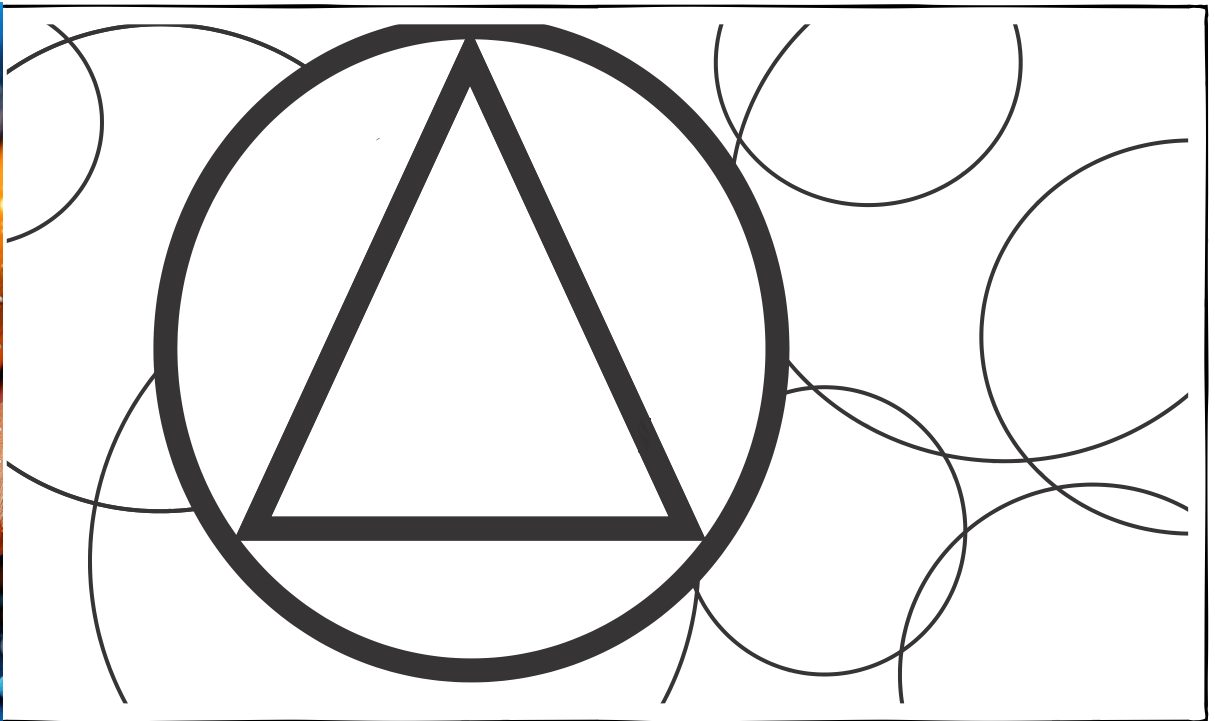
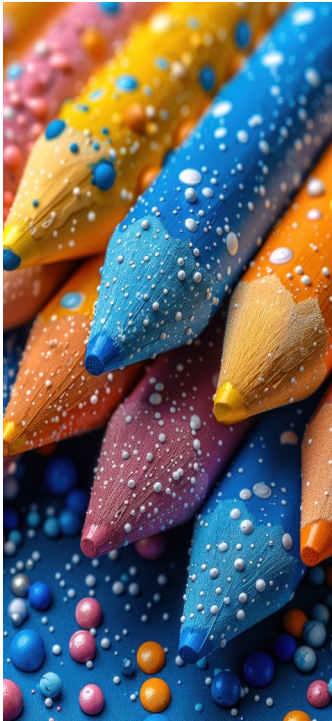
