*Information from Your Central Office:*

A loyal member of AA in Baton Rouge purchased a copy of the first printing of the first edition of *Alcoholic Anonymous* (the Big Book). In 2008, it was donated to the Central Office. The prior Office Manager kept the book safe. With his death several years ago, his sponsor retained possession of the book. After much discussion over the past 18 months, it was decided that the most prudent course is for the book to be donated to the LSU Special Collections where it can be most safely stored and also made available to those interested in seeing it. It has recently been cataloged and processed by LSU.
