Central Office Representatives Meeting (COR)

Every AA home group can have a voice in the running of the AA Central Office for this area. (In some places this is referred to as the “Intergroup Office.”)

This office is responsible for maintaining a list of meeting places and times, and offer an opportunity to purchase Conference Approved Materials. The Central Office has a telephone line and list in the telephone book as a contact point for those seeking recovery or information on recovery. In Baton Rouge, the Central Office also recruits volunteers to provide 12-Step Calls and volunteers to answer the telephone when the office is not open. The Central Office is responsible for holding a “Big Book Study” on an annual basis.

Each month the Central Office Representatives meet to discuss issues relating to the operation of the office. In the fall, the CORs elect members to serve on the Central Office Committee (COC) which acts as an Executive Board and hires the Central Office Manager.

The COR meeting is on the second Thursday of each month in the meeting room at the Central Office. At the August meeting, changes in the bylaws will be voted on. In September the ballot for the election of new members of the COC will be presented (to be voted on in October).
