7th Tradition and Virtual Meetings

The General Service Office has recently released an updated "FAQ on Practicing the Seventh Tradition at Virtual Meetings" [on this page: https://www.aa.org/pages/en_US/update-on-covid-19-coronavirus]. It is a PDF file available for download.

Here are some points to consider:

- The spirit of self-support ensures that even minimal expenses are borne by the whole group rather than by individual members. In addition, many groups want to continue support for other A.A. services. Local intergroup/central offices still have bills to pay, such as rent and utilities. Many have employees who are working hard to keep meeting information updated and respond to calls for help.
- ♦ Here are some of the digital payment platforms that groups using: Apple Pay, Cash-App,Google Pay, PayPal, Venmo and Zelle. Information on options being used locally may be available from your intergroup/central office, district or area.
- Groups often compare the costs and benefits of each platform, considering things likeease of set up and use, payment processing fees, security, privacy, and how commonly known it is. Some groups offer multiple options for their members.
- ♦ It is helpful to choose a username for the account that is simple and intuitive since it will be shared with those attending the meeting. Groups usually avoid using a personal email that reveals someone's full name so as not to compromise that person's anonymity. Often at the beginning of a digital meeting, or during a break, groups will share the username through the chat or a screen share as they make an announcement about practicing the Seventh Tradition. It is recommended that groups do not share the username as part of the meeting's public online information.
- Some digital payment platforms have social components that members may want to disable to protect anonymity. For example, members have shared about changing the privacy settings on Venmo so contributions are only visible to the sender and recipient. A couple of intergroup/central offices have posted helpful guides to practicing the Seventh Tradition at virtual meetings
