## Changes ... Changes ... Changes

The summer issue of Box 4-5-9: News and Notes from the General Service Office of A.A.® includes a summary report of actions taken at the 71st General Service Conference. The Conference is made up of 93 delegates, 26 trustees and corporate directors from A.A.W.S. and Grapevine, along with 13 General Service Office, Grapevine and La Viña staff members. They met virtually. This is only the second time this meeting has been held virtually. en box459 summer 2021.pdf, and the full report of all the actions will be formally sent to all GSRs (Group Service Representatives).

Here are some of the highlights:

♦ From the Literature Committee:

That a fifth edition of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect current membership;
That revisions be made in the essays on Steps Six and Twelve in Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions and the long form of each Tradition be added at the end of each respective chapter;

That the pamphlet "A.A. for the Black and African -American Alcoholic" be updated and the draft pamphlet for Spanish-speaking women in A.A. be approved;

That a draft version of the book, *Alcoholics Anonymous* (Fourth Edition), be translated into plain and simple language and be developed in a way that is accessible and relatable to as wide of an audience as possible.

- ♦ From the Corrections Committee: That revisions be made to A.A.W.S. literature directed to members behind the walls and that the terms "inmate" and "offender" be replaced with "person in custody."
- ⋄ From the floor of the Conference: That the Preamble revision replacing the words "men and women" with the word "people" be presented to the General Service Board for approval as the new revised A.A. Preamble.

#### The Traditions

Editor's Note: Last month we began a series of articles about The Traditions. Last month's article was called "What Are AA's 12 Traditions And Why Should I Care?" This month we present Tradition One.

#### Tradition One

Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon AA unity.

Do you remember when you were drinking and felt utterly alone?

I do.

I never want to feel that way again. When I came to AA, you let me know that I was not alone and I never had to be again. You talked to me about your experiences and they were so close to mine that I wondered how you could know what was in my head. You helped me to find the fellowship I craved.

Our fellowship is precious and it must be preserved no matter what. Most of us can't stay sober without it and, if we can't stay sober, we will die.

As the 1<sup>st</sup> step is the foundation on which all the other 11 are built, it is the same with the 1<sup>st</sup> tradition. All the other traditions are ways in which we can stay unified. Because if we do not stand together, we will die apart.

AA fiercely safeguards the individual's right to live and work the program as they wish. No one can tell you that you must do anything to be a member of AA. However, we must maintain the solidarity of our fellowship no matter what.

This first tradition gives us the reason for *all* of the other traditions. All of AA's 12 traditions boil down to one thing; how to safeguard our fellowship while maintaining individual freedoms.
