The Traditions

Editor's Note: This is the fourth in a series of articles about The Traditions. Last month was Tradition Two. This month we move on to Tradition Three.

Last month we stated that while Tradition 1 is the only Tradition that discusses AA's unity, all of the Traditions are ways to preserve that unity. We must stick together or die apart. Tradition 2 parallels the second step in acknowledging the higher power, and establishing the role of those who take leadership positions.

Remember that the 12 Traditions were developed by trial and error. Our founders floundered at times. Several times. Then they wrote down what did not work so that we wouldn't have to make the same mistakes again. The stories of how they learned these lessons are in the 12 Steps & 12 Traditions and in Alcoholics *Anonymous Comes of Age*. These monthly articles are simply to give a brief overview. We highly suggest you research further.

Tradition 3

The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking.

Do you have a problem with alcohol? Do you want to stop drinking? Congratulations! You qualify for membership in Alcoholics Anonymous. This is the <u>only</u> requirement. And we aren't really strict about that. If you don't know if you have a problem, we'll help you figure it out. If you don't really want to stop yet, we'll welcome you in hopes that you decide that you want to work the 12 Steps.

You are a member ONLY if you say you are.
