The Traditions

Editor's Note: This is the fifth in a series of articles about The Traditions. We have now moved to Tradition Four.

Previously, we discussed the first 3 Traditions. We talked about the fact that no one is in charge of AA, and that you are a member if you say you are. That sounds like there are no rules in AA. Technically, that is true. No one will kick you out of AA for not conforming. The Traditions are guidelines that we have developed by almost destroying AA. While they are not rules, they are very strong suggestions. We cannot tell you that you "must". But we can tell you that we did that, and it's not a very good idea.

Tradition 4

Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole.

What does "autonomous" mean? According to the dictionary it means "Having the freedom to govern itself or control its own affairs."

Have you ever noticed that no two AA meetings are alike? Some are open discussion. Some are literature studies. Some are speaker meetings. Some are gender specific. Some are profession specific. Some pray. Some don't. Some read. Some don't. Yet all are AA meetings. The 12 & 12 states "Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an AA group provided that as a group they have no other affiliation". That means that you can do whatever type of meeting you want.

But what if our meeting affects other meetings? What if we want to start a women's meeting right next door and on the same night as another women's meeting? While no one will stop us, this would be wrong and dangerous. In a real-world example, due to resentment, an AA clubhouse was started next door to another clubhouse. The result was that both clubhouses died.

Every so often, the media will report on the supposed wrongdoing of an AA group. It may be that they are in fact doing things that are downright shady. But when the reporter contacts AA's General Service Office to find out what AA is going to do about it, the answer is always that each group is autonomous and can do as they wish.

Have you also noticed that you never see "The First Methodist Group" as the name of a meeting? In fact, you never see a group named after its meeting place. That's what "non-affiliation" means. If we named the group after the church (or whatever the meeting place), we would give the impression that we were affiliated with them. Our Preamble states "AA is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes." We do not affiliate with anyone outside of AA.

So, each group can do as they wish, as long as they, as a group, do not affiliate with anyone outside of AA and as long as what they do does not affect other groups or AA as a whole.
