

The Traditions

Editor's Note: This is the seventh in a series of articles about The Traditions. We have now moved to Tradition Six.

Previously, we discussed the first 5 Traditions. We talked about the fact that no one is in charge of AA, and that you are a member if you say you are. That sounds like there are no rules in AA. Technically, that is true. No one will kick you out of AA for not conforming. The Traditions are guidelines that we have developed by almost destroying AA. While they are not rules, they are very strong suggestions. We cannot tell you that you "must". But we can tell you that we did that, and it's not a very good idea.

Tradition 6

 $An\ A.A.$ group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

The long form of this tradition is one of the longest, and it offers more context to this tradition: Problems of money, property, and authority may easily divert us from our primary spiritual aim. We think, therefore, that any considerable property of genuine use to A.A. should be separately incorporated and managed, thus dividing the material from the spiritual. An A.A. group, as such, should never go into business. Secondary aids to A.A., such as clubs or hospitals which require much property or administration, ought to be incorporated and so set apart that, if necessary, they can be freely discarded by the groups. Hence such facilities ought not to use the A.A. name. Their management should be the sole responsibility of those people who financially support them. For clubs, A.A. managers are usually preferred. But hospitals, as well as other places of recuperation, ought to be well outside A.A. – and medically supervised. While an A.A. group may cooperate with anyone, such cooperation ought never go so far as affiliation or endorsement, actual or implied. An A.A. group can bind itself to no one.

This tradition is the reason why when you see "club houses" they do not have the full, proper name of Alcoholics Anonymous attached to them. In the greater Baton Rouge area, the club house names have stayed well away from the official name ("Stepping Stones," "Club 12," "1-12 Club"). In other parts of the country they get a little closer, after all we alcoholics are clever people who like to toe the line. You will often find an Alano Club (ALcholics ANOnymous) as a place to find recovery meetings. Each of these buildings is, and the long form of the tradition suggests, separately incorporated, and there are groups and meetings which come and go, open and fold, and move from place to place.


